5 STEP RULE HOW TO DEAL WITH AN ASTHMA ATTACK



SIT UP AND STAY CALM DO NOT LIE DOWN



TAKE SLOW STEADY BREATHS



TAKE 1 PUFF OF RELIEVER
INHALER USUALLY BLUE EVERY
MINUTE USE A SPACER IF AVAILABLE
PEOPLE AGED 6+— UP TO 10 PUFFS IN 10 MINS
CHILDREN UNDER 6— UP TO 6 PUFFS IN 10 MINS



CALL 112 OR 999 IF YOUR SYMPTOMS DO NOT IMPROVE AFTER 10 MINUTES



REPEAT STEP 3 IF AN AMBULANCE HAS NOT ARRIVED IN 10 MINUTES

IF SOMEONE HAS AN ASTHMA ATTACK:

- Do not leave them on their own.
- · Extra puffs of reliever inhaler (usually blue) are safe.
